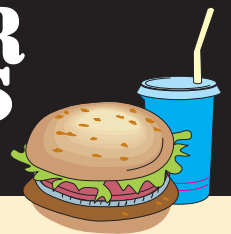

Make sauce from first ingredients (except onions and potatoes). Place half the potatoes in greased 2 quart casserole dish. Cover with half the onions and half the sauce. Repeat layers. Cover and bake at 350 degree about one hour. Before serving, sprinkle grated cheese over top of casserole (optional).

We had great participation at the St. Patrick's fundraiser. We sold our allotment of tickets, thanks to Just Good Meat, which paid for all of them.

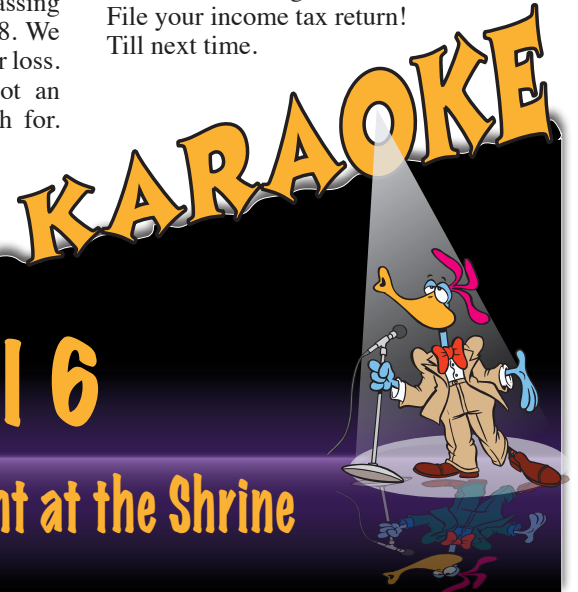

Both of these therapies provide weight-bearing opportunities and can help stimulate muscles and build strength and stamina. Some of our hospitals also offer robotic assisted gait training via the ReWalk exoskeleton system.

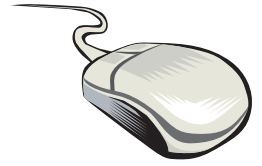
