Greetings everyone! I hope everyone is enjoying spring!



Corvette College: This month I will cover a topic most people probably don't think about, chrome bumpers. When the first Corvette rolled off the production line June 30, 1953 it had chrome bumpers, and they continued through the next three generations until the 1973 C3 model. Government mandated safety regulations required all cars to be able to sustain a five mile per hour impact on the front end without damaging the lights or other safety equipment. The Chevrolet engineers redesigned the front of the 1973 Corvette but not the back, which left that model with a one-year-only hodgepodge arrangement, with an injection molded urethane bumper cover painted the color of the car on the front and a prominent chrome bumper on the rear of the car carried over from the year before. This makes the 1973 Corvette unique but it's up to each to decide if that is in a good way or not. Typically the 1973 model does not command the same money as do the other C3 cars. This was the end of an era. Chrome bumpers never again graced the ends of the Corvette.
