The onion recipe for this month is VIDALIA ONION MEDLEY. 1 pound mild or hot sausage, 5 large Vidalia or yellow sweet onions, thinly sliced, 24 Ritz crackers, coarsely crumbled, 1 can (10.75-oz) cream of mushroom soup, 1 cup sour cream and 1/2 cup sharp cheddar cheese, shredded. In a large skillet, crumble and brown sausage until cooked through. Drain and set aside. Spray a 13" x 9" x 2" Pyrex dish with cooking spray. Place one layer of onions (about 2 onions) in bottom of baking dish. Sprinkle with half crackers. Top with half sausage. Repeat with another layer. Top with remaining onions. In a bowl, mix soup and sour cream. Spread over casserole. Sprinkle with cheese. Bake at 385 degrees for 30 minutes.
