The Onion recipe for this month: Ingredients, 2-3 whole Vidalia onions, 4 tbsp stick unsalted butter, Garlic salt to taste, Pepper to taste, 1 cup sharp cheddar cheese the better quality, the better taste, 1 cup mozzarella Cheese, 1/2 cup Parmesan Chesse and Fresh oregano or other herbs for garnish.

Instructions: Using non-stick cooking spray, prepare a 9 X 13 baking dish. Heat oven to 350, slice the Vidalia onions in 1/4 to 1/2 inch slices and separate the rings, lay the rings in the prepared baking dish, sprinkle the onion rings with garlic salt (about 1 tsp, pepper 1/2 tsp), cut the butter into pats and place around the dish on top of the onions, spread the cheddar and mozzarella cheese on top of the onions and top with the grated parmesan cheese. Bake at 350 uncovered for 30 minutes or until bubbly and the cheese has started to brown (brown cheese bits is one of the best parts!). Remove from the oven, allow to cool for a few minutes, garnish with some fresh herbs (oregano, chives, thyme all work well) and then serve.

Hope everyone is enjoying the warmer weather and hope the water will soon go down.



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
