
We continue to plan for our upcoming Wine Tasting event in the fall. We will of course send more info to you all.



As promised last month, six of us did attend the General Auxiliary meeting in Minneapolis. The following information was gathered:

- Money spent for wheelchairs / Mobility equipment: \$198,392.48
- Money spent for Christmas bags: \$1,800.41
- Money received by General Auxiliary 2021: \$227,262,46
- Money we took to Minneapolis: \$1.500.00
- Needed by General Auxiliary for kids: Games:

Yahtzee, Jenga, Sorry, Monopoly, Connect 4, Candyland, Chutes & Ladders, Let's Go Fishing, Matching Games, and others; Girls: small to medium baby dolls, Barbies, Tea sets, Princess items, My Little Pony items, arts and crafts; Boys: Hot Wheels/single or sets, action figures, Nerf items, small to medium trucks, Lego sets; Infants/Toddlers: musical & light up toys, remote & chatter phones, ring stacks, medical kits, pull toys; Older kids: nail polish sets, small purses, jewelry, handheld games, Rubix cubes, earbuds; Miscellaneous: Etch a Sketch, Magna Doodles, Earbuds, arts & crafts, Playdough kits; Blankets: two sizes only either 5'x7' or 3'x3' fleece in kid friendly pattern, may be single layer, can be tied or sewn edges

We raffled off four gift baskets and one very large beautiful wreath and realized \$900. In addition, wine bottle lights and a few other items netted us \$143. We split the money from the wine bottles with the LOH Ladies, as this was their project to begin with.

We asked if each child gets a gift each time they see the clinic, the answer was yes. They hand out Christmas bags beginning the Monday after Thanksgiving. That means they need the items for the bags by October 15, and we must have them by September 25. I know that we can count on all of Tangierdom to help us do our part.

We learned many of the smaller auxiliaries actually make and give more money than we do. Perhaps some of you can come up with ways to increase our money making efforts. One of the smaller auxiliaries presented a check for \$4000 to the General Auxiliary the day of the meeting and that was not their only contribution for the year. We could use some more thinkers.


#### load Runners



#### Go West Young Man

"Go West Young Man, Go West" is a phrase often credited to Horace Greeley, editor of the New York Tribune. However, Greeley did not coin the phrase. John B. L. Soule first used the expression in 1851. Greeley changed it slightly in an 1865 editorial when he suggested "Go West, young man, and grow up with the country." Many Civil War Veterans, and civilians alike, accepted the challenge and moved west to stake their claim on a homestead, try their hand in business, or otherwise embrace all that the burgeoning west had to offer.

Albeit one hundred and ten years later; and not in as dramatic a fashion as those in covered wagons in the 1800's, Tangier Shrine, too, made their way west. But where did the journey begin?

The Tangier Temple leadership and general membership had long aspired to own and manage their own facility and grounds. Prior to moving west, Tangier Temple held offices downtown in the Farnam Building, built in 1929, at 1613 Farnam Street and held their meetings and activities at the Masonic Temple at 19th and Douglas Streets. In many cases, larger events required the renting of other venues around the city, the Civic Auditorium is one example. In 1975, under the leadership of Claude Jelen and the Divan, active steps were taken to research, locate and purchase an independent and separate site for Tangier Temple. The below resolutions were drafted and read.

#### Resolution: Read and laid over to next meeting for adoption or rejection. October 1975.

Resolved Whereas Tangier Temple A.A.O.N.M.S is meeting downtown in the Masonic Temple and would like to be in and own their own building in another location, be it resolved that the Board of Trustees be empowered to enter into negotiations to purchase land and building not to exceed \$400,000.00, excluding any remodeling costs. (\$400,000 in 1975 would have the same "buying power" as \$2,149,509.29 in 2022)

#### Resolution: Read November 13, 1975

Whereas, Tangier Temple by and through the Board of Trustees, in its wisdom, feels and has determined that it is for the welfare of the Temple and its membership, its many and numerous functions and activities that the Temple by and through the Tangier Temple Holding Corporation a non-profit Corporation whose Officers and Trustees are the Board of Trustees of Tangier Temple should proceed with acquiring, owning and operating its own real estate facilities in which the Temple can carry on and conduct its many activities and functions and

Whereas, the Tangier Temple Holding Corporation is not funded and is therefore without funds to purchase, acquire and/or operate such real estate and/or property and building thereto.

Be it therefore resolved that the Board of Trustees, Tangier Temple be and herby is directed and authorized and empowered for and on behalf of Tangier Temple membership to promptly proceed with a program of raising money in a way of donations and contributions, by and through the membership or other individuals to carry on the program herein.

Be it further resolved that in addition to the above, the Board of Trustees is hereby authorized and directed to fund the Tangier Temple Holding Corporation, a non-profit corporation with money of Tangier Temple, no otherwise restricted, such funding to be within the discretion of the Board of Trustees and determined to be necessary and proper to carry on the program herein contemplated.

With the Tangier Temple membership on board and the above resolutions adopted, the search for the new home of Tangier Temple began. Several locations were scouted and at least one location, highly desired, was sold to another party before Tangier was able to make an offer. Another location, with a storied history, was soon identified.

In May of 1962 Ross, Lou and Al Caniglia announced that the construction of a \$600,000 restaurant had begun at Eighty Fourth and Center Streets. The Caniglia brothers went on to say, to allay any fears, they would continue the restaurant at 1114 South Seventh Street which they began in 1946. The new restaurant, to be known as "Palazzo Taliano" was designed after the Caniglia brothers studied several European Cafes. Al boldly stated, "There won't be anything like it between Chicago and the West Coast!" The location was made up of a restaurant, cocktail lounge, meeting rooms and included a production facility for pizza mix, frozen pizzas, and salad dressing. The brothers celebrated their one-year anniversary in May 1964 by honoring their customers with a free bottle of Chianti to the first 200 tables.

By 1970, the Caniglia brothers had interests in other restaurants and businesses and in late 1970 sold the restaurant to two real estate partners: Senator Roman Hruska and Russell Brehm. Hruska and Brehm would not hold the property long. The property was purchased by David and Audrey Hayden and became known as Hayden's West. The couple, who also owned the Hayden House and the Birchwood Club, operated Hayden's West as a dinner and entertainment venue. Hayden's West was closed in early 1972 and an auction was held in March to liquidate its contents. Audrey (Monroe) Hayden was a sister to Arthur Lynn Monroe, P.P. 1971. She passed away in Flagstaff Arizona on October 4, 2015, at age 100 years 8 months.

By July 1972, a group of partners, including Richard Solowicz, Joan Edwards White and David James Witherspoon, had purchased the property and began remodeling the building. Their business plan was to create a dinner theater to be called the "Talk of the Town Dinner Theater. They would focus upon the classics, "Camelot," "Oklahoma," "Arsenic and Old Lace," and "Harvey," to name a few. The dinner theater operated for two years and was then closed in 1974. It reopened, briefly, in March of 1975, but closed three months later.

On December 19, 1975, Glenn M. Timmons, owner of Timmons Contracting Corporation purchased the building and 2.16 acres for \$337,000 from David J. Witherspoon, chairman of the board of Pamida Inc.

In early January 1976, the unoccupied dinner theater was leased to Tangier Temple for \$340,000. Under the leadership of Paul Hickman and the Divan, a Building Fund Committee was formed and tasked with creating a campaign with a goal of achieving \$500,000. The additional funds, over and above the \$340,000, would be earmarked for improvements within the facility and expansion to the parking areas from 156 to 200 spaces. An open house was held in February 1976 at the new Tangier Mosque with over one thousand attendees. March 11, 1976, marked the date of the first Tangier Temple stated meeting at its new independent location.

In 1987 Potentate Gene Moberg and the Divan commenced a fund drive and the remaining balance of the mortgage was paid off! The Board of Trustees, Claude Jelen, Paul Hickman, Gene Moberg and most importantly, the membership that raised the funds, each deserve our continued gratitude.

And now you know..... the rest of the story.....





