Arbor Shrine





All of those serving in positions for 2023 have been installed and ready to serve in their duties, I know with their directions, Trangier will have a good and successful year.

The colder winter days are halfway over and in a short period of time we will in the warmer days so everyone can again get out to enjoy outdoor activities.

Onion recipe for this month.

Our instructions are for one onion, but you can easily bake up to six onions on the same baking sheet for an impressive dinner party spread.

Step #1 First, preheat your oven to 350°F. Peel your onion, leaving the root intact. If your onion sits level, you can leave it alone. If not, cut a thin slice off the root to create a flat bottom.

Step #2 Use a paring knife to cut a 1-inchdeep cone into the top of the onion.

Step #3 Insert a vegetable, chicken, or beef bouillon cube into the hole. We're using a standard-sized 4-gram bouillon cube here, not extra-large ones. You can cut large ones smaller as needed. If you're using granulated bouillon, use 1 tablespoon. Alternatively, you can use 1 teaspoon of your favorite seasoning blend. I really like to use Italian Sausage Seasoning or Montreal Chicken Seasoning with these onions. Note that if the blend doesn't contain salt, add 1/4 teaspoon of salt.

Step #4 Fill the rest of the hole with butter, about 1-2 tablespoons. Season with salt and pepper.

Step #5 Place the filled onion on a sheet of foil large enough to encase it. Wrap the onion in foil, bringing the edges up in the center.

Step #6 Twist the foil together to seal the onion in. Place the foil-wrapped onion on a baking sheet.

Step #7 Bake for 45-60 minutes, until the onion is tender. Serve warm.

A birthday celebration was held on January 25th for Lady Barb Madsen's 95th birthday. Congratulations and Happy Birthday Barb!



Greetings Nobles and Ladies,

The year was 1879. Rutherford B. Hayes was in the White House, still attempting to reconcile the divisions remaining after the Civil War. Frank Woolworth opened the first of what would be many 5 and 10-cent stores on February 22 in Utica New York. Milk was sold in glass bottles for the first time, in April. New York's "Gilmore's Garden" was renamed "Madison Square Garden" after President James Madison, in May and Thomas Edison began testing the first practical electric light bulb, in October. Edison would demonstrate his incandescent lighting for the public in Menlo Park on December 31. Electricity and Lighting would play a significant role in the life of the subject of this sketch.

James Edward Davidson was born on Nov. 10, 1879, in Flint Michigan, the first of five children of Wilber Davidson and Margaretta (Turner) Davidson. In 1890, in Port Huron, his father constructed a 23 room home for his growing family. The home still stands and was placed on the National Register of Historic Places in 1972. Wilbur had many business interests in Michigan, specifically in Port Huron. He established a successful dry good business, was involved in real estate, insurance, banking, and other interests. His most important achievement may have been his organization of the Port Huron Light and Power Co. Not surprisingly, the Davidson home was the first electrified home in Port Huron.

As a youngster, James had a three-mile route of 106 subscribers to the Port Huron newspaper. He also was paid 50 cents a week, by a banker, to drive a cow from its pasture to be milked. During summer breaks and vacations, much of his time was spent at the Port Huron Powerhouse.

James attended public school in Port Huron and then took a business course at the Detroit Business University. Upon leaving school, he immediately went to work at the power plant shoveling coal for \$1 a day. Six to eight tons was common during a twelve-hour day. One night in 1899, during an outage, the superintendent was not on the job. James handled the crisis with such skill that he was made the superintendent the next day. He received \$75 a month and was on call around the clock. James took to the job and helped wherever needed. It was all hands on deck, in those days. He especially looked after the veteran engineers who, while unable to read or write, had taught him about the machinery of this invention called "electricity." He was 21 years of age and on his way to a 50-year career in the Power Industry.

It wasn't all work with James, however, on April 15, 1903, he married Edith Lisle Stokes in Philadelphia Pennsylvania. They would be blessed with three children: Dorothy, James Jr., and John Davidson.


James continued to make a name for himself within the industry and would consistently be sought to evaluate and run companies. He was convinced by New York bankers to leave Port Huron and relocate to Vermont to run the Consolidated Lighting Company (CLC) in Montpelier. At age 30, James was enjoying his family and a \$4,000 a year position in Vermont. He was asked to survey Pacific Power on the West Coast. He didn't come back to Vermont. He was made general operations manager for Oregon, Washington and Idaho, ultimately rising to V.P and General Manager. In 1917 James was wooed to a new post, this time in Omaha. He was installed as V.P. and General Manager of the Omaha Electric Light and Power Company, soon to become the Nebraska Power Company. He was made President in 1928. When the company became publicly owned and known as OPPD in 1946, he was made General Manager.

While James was driven in his career, his community was of equal importance. He was a leader in Masonic and Shrine orders and was President and a Governor of Aksarben for many years, reigning as King in 1923. His daughter would be crowned Queen in 1927. He was a leader in the Liberty Loan and Red Cross during WWI and headed the Community Chest in 1923 & 1926. James was a close friend of Msgr. E.J. Flanagan, on the Boys Town Board of Trustees beginning in 1924, and one of the civic leaders who helped establish Boys Town. He was also instrumental in the creation of he municipal airport.

James had long been a hunter and was looking forward to an upcoming hunt. On November 12, 1949, Roal Carlson, his assistant for 22 years and Jack Wilson, General Manager of the General Electric Company picked him up at 5:15 a.m. They stopped at a café for breakfast, on their way to their blinds on the John Zimmerman farm a few miles west of Gretna. The decoys were placed, and Mr. Carlson went to one blind and Wilson and Davidson took position in the other. James took his shotgun out of its case and remarked, "Jack, it looks like we're going to have a pretty good day." He leaned back, it was thought to relax, and then slumped against his friend. At his side was his black lab, Jed. His death came among friends engaged in a favorite activity, with his trusted dog by his side, two days after his 70th birthday.

Once asked how he had been so successful, he stated, "When I was a boy, I was always anxious to hear the kind of sermon which would tell in a practical way the principles of success that one should carry in one's mind. Not having heard it. I began to think for myself. I found the answer in a one-line quotation in the Bible: "As he thinketh in his heart, so is he." In my humble way, I have attempted to weave this thought into my work as an employee and later as an executive of a public utility. Ninety-Nine per cent of the battle of life is using your head – thinking, developing your brain. Luck won't turn the trick. Luck is the alibi of the superstitious."


