



It is with a heavy heart that I must report the passing of two of our long-time Chanters. On March 15, 2018, John L. Bohrer, who had been our former director, was called to his reward. Under John's direction, the Chanters won Central States Competition every year we competed except once, i.e., about 14 times. In Imperial competition under his direction, we won three times in a row. Noble Bohrer became less active in the Chanters when he was elected to the Divan, and he eventually became Potentate of Tangier in 1992. The Tangier Chanters continue to be a viable group today because of his service.

Roger Coffey, who was one of our lead tenors and sang many solos during the Chanters Annual Christmas performances for several years, joined the "great celestial choir" on March 29, 2018. Roger was deeply involved in the Masonic Fraternity. He was a Past Master and 50-year member of Cobia Lodge #631 in Council Bluffs. He was a Past-Patron of Council Bluffs Chapter #441 Order of the Eastern Star and Past Associate Bethel Guardian of Bethel #1 Council Bluffs Job's Daughters. Roger was the Tangier Shrine Chanter's Lieutenant in 2002 and was Captain in 2003, when this author was elected Secretary. The Chanters joined with members of Broadway United Methodist Church in Council Bluffs and sang at his funeral service on April 4, 2018.

A quartet of Chanters (the "In-Chanters") has been asked to sing for Nebraska Order of the Eastern Star's Grand Session in Kearney during the week of May 7th.
