



Quarter onion halfway through and open slightly. Place on an 18-in. X 12-in. piece of heavy-duty foil. Place butter in center of onion; sprinkle with seasonings. Fold foil to seal tightly. Bake at 350 degrees for 60-70 minutes or until onion is tender. Open foil carefully to allow steam to escape.







Harold Lloyd Imperial Potentate 1949-1950

The city of Burchard Nebraska was platted in the year 1881, as a consequence of the Chicago, Burlington & Quincy Railroad being extended south toward the Nebraska and Kansas border. The community of Burchard was named after a local clergyman and was incorporated in 1884. The town saw its peak population in 1900 realizing 297 inhabitants.

While the community may have remained small, 76 inhabitants in the 2020 census, it can claim a few notable citizens that, in their own way, have woven themselves into the fabric of America.





Major General Charles Corlett, or "Cowboy Pete" as he was known, was born in Burchard in 1889 and served in the U.S. Army from 1913-1946. He was instrumental in commanding troops in both the Pacific and European Theaters during WWII. Harlan Pyle, otherwise known as "Firpo", was born in Burchard in 1905. While his time engaged in our nations "National Pastime" was short, he did make the roster of the Cincinnati Reds in 1928.

The subject of this biographical sketch is Harold Lloyd. Don't recognize the name? How about a visual? Think back to the silent movie era and picture a bespectacled man hanging from the hands of a clock, high above the city below. There you have Harold Lloyd.

Harold Clayton Lloyd Sr. was born in Burchard Nebraska on April 20, 1893, to James and Sarah (Fraser) Lloyd. Harold would become one of the most influential film comedians of the silent film era, making both silent and "talkies" between 1914 and 1947.

In 1900 the family can be found living in Denver Colorado. His father was working as a clerk in a shoe store. In 1910, after his father's failed business ventures, his parents divorced. James, along with oldest son Gaylord, moved to San Diego California, while Harold and his mother continued to live in Colorado with his maternal grandmother, a 76-year-old Park Ranger with the U.S. Forest Service.

By age 20 Harold had moved to Los Angeles and begun taking juvenile roles in several Keystone Film Company comedies. Soon, he would become acquainted with Hal Roach who had formed his own studio in 1913. Roach and Lloyd created a character called "Lonesome Luke", modeled after the success of Charlie Chaplin. Bebe Daniels was hired to support Lloyd in his films and would become romantically involved with Lloyd during their film collaboration.

In 1919, Daniels did not renew her contract with Roach and she, Roach and Lloyd went their separate ways. That same year, while posing for publicity photos, Lloyd grabbed what he thought was a "prop bomb" and lit it. It exploded, causing him to lose his right thumb and forefinger, as well as severely burning his face and chest and injuring one eye. This experience had an immediate impact upon his career, but also upon his later decision making. Fortunately, Lloyd would recover and retain his eyesight. Due to the use of a special glove and clever filming, his injury was not visible in his future films.

With Daniels departure, Roach and Lloyd were forced to find a new support player. Lloyd hired Mildred Davis to replace Daniels. Her arrival quickly impacted both Lloyd's professional and personal life. The couple were married in 1923 and began a family that would number three children. Gloria was born in 1923, adopted daughter Marjorie was born in 1924 and joined the family in 1930 and Harold Jr. was born in 1931.

In 1924, Lloyd formed his own production company, leaving the Hal Roach Studios. His films continued to be very successful, and Lloyd became the highest paid film performer throughout the 1920's.

While enjoying a successful film career, in 1925, Lloyd became a Freemason in the Alexander Hamilton Lodge No. 535 in Hollywood. He moved quickly through the York and Scottish Rite degrees and then joined the Al-Malaikah Shrine in Los Angeles. There can be no doubt that overcoming his own injuries and burns formed the basis for his decision to become a Shriner.

Lloyd joined the Divan and was Potentate of Al-Malaikah Shrine. His commitment was such that he was later elected to the Imperial Divan and became Imperial Potentate in 1949-1950. His installation ceremony was attended by 90,000 people and was held at Soldier Field. Those in attendance included U.S. President Harry S. Truman.

On Monday, March 20, 1950, Tangier Potentate Allen C. Scott welcomed Lloyd to Omaha. His one-day trip included visiting the Masonic Home for Boys, where twenty-one Herefords were outfitted with cardboard horn-rimmed glasses in his honor. Noble Judge Lester Palmer, in preparation for the visit, wrote a special song that was delivered to Lloyd by the Tangier Chanters. The day culminated with a "Building Americanism" themed program held for those in the Masonic family at the Orpheum Theater.

Lloyd passed away on March 8, 1971 at this home, Geenacres, in Beverly Hills at the age of 77. His former co-star Bebe Daniels died eight days after Lloyd and his son, Harold Lloyd Jr., died three months after his father.

Official Call for Elections Thursday, December 8, 2022 Tangier Shriners, Oasis of Omaha, Desert of Nebraska

The annual elections of Tangier Shriners will be held on Thursday, December 8, 2022 at 2823 S. 84th Street, Omaha Nebraska at 7:30 p.m. No later than 9:00 p.m. the annual election will start. Tangier Temple will elect seven Divan members, a Trustee for a four year term, Representatives to the Imperial Council and Central States Shrine Association, and any openings which may occur in the interim.

Members must have their 2022 Dues Card for admission to this meeting

FROM IMPERIAL BY-LAWS (IOWA CORPORATION)

Article 25

- 325.4 When Elected. Each Temple must elect its Officers and Representatives at its annual meeting in January unless its bylaws allow the election to occur at the temple's stated meeting in December.
- 325.5 Ballot. Election of officers shall be by separate written ballot and by a majority vote of those present and voting. A blanket ballot is prohibited.
- 325.6 Time of Election. Nominations must commence no later than 9:00 p.m. and when that hour arrives all other business must cease and none may be transacted until the election is concluded.
- 325.7 Other Officers. The Temple may elect such other officers as its Bylaws provide.
- 325.8 Nominations. Candidates for office and Representatives must be placed in nomination from the floor.
- 325.10Representatives.
 - (a) Where a Temple elects more than one Representative, all candidates must be balloted for on one written ballot.
 - (b) Each member voting must vote only for the total number of Representatives to be elected, otherwise his ballot cannot be counted as a vote.
 - (c) A majority of those present and voting is necessary to elect each Representative.
 - (d) Only those candidates who receive a majority vote shall be declared elected.
 - (e) Successive written ballots must then be taken in the same manner on other candidates until all Representatives are elected.
 - (f) If more candidates receive a majority vote than the number of Representatives to be elected, then those receiving the greatest number of votes shall be declared elected.
 - (g) Blank ballots or ballots containing any markings other than the name of a candidate nominated from the floor are not votes and are not to be considered for any purpose.

325.11Election Regulations.

- (a) A candidate for an elected office in a Shrine temple may print, publish and circulate during the year he is seeking the elected office, a resume consisting of his educational background, his vocational history, and his Masonic and Shrine record. Except as provided in the prior sentence, the printing, publication, circulating or distribution of resolutions, letters, telegrams, tickets, email or other devices, by a unit, club, Noble, or group of Nobles, suggesting, recommending, opposing, or containing the names of proposed candidates for office in the temple is prohibited.
- (b) The expenditure of money for gifts, favors, or entertainment on behalf of a candidate for elected office is prohibited.
- (c) For any violation of (a) or (b), the Imperial Potentate may suspend any offending Noble, and he may declare the election of the officers void and order a new election.
- (d) At least one week prior to the annual meeting or any election, the temple Recorder shall mail to each member a notice thereof containing this section.


