Thanks also go out to Rich and Kathy Roenfeld for the oasis and some good brotherhood after the Carson parade.


The Corvette Club had a great showing at CSSA down in Branson. We had 18 Corvettes drive down and participate in the events including the competition and parade on Saturday morning.




Why do Americans hate the dandelion? We love our green lawns and anything that seems to threaten our turf must be an enemy.







SPECIAL MEETING NOTICE

A special meeting of Tangier Shriners will be held on September 13, 2018 at 7:15 pm at Tangier Shrine Center, 2823 S. 84th St, Omaha Nebraska. The sole order of business will be a proposal to amend Subparagraphs (a)-(d) of Article 6, Section 6.13 of the Tangier Shriners Bylaws - Fricke/Jackson Fund Investment. This meeting has been called and the proposed amendment has been presented in accordance with the Bylaws of Shriners International and Tangier Shriners.

Currently, Subparagraphs (a)-(d) of Article 6, Section 6.13 of the Tangier Shriners Bylaws read as follows:

- (a) Up to 90% of the positive growth of the Fund, not to exceed \$50,000 in any year, may be used by the Board of Directors during the following calendar year. At least 10% of the positive growth shall be retained in the Fund and reinvested to grow the Fund for future needs.
- (b) The Fund, including additions to the Fund, are otherwise exempt from expenditure for any purpose whatsoever, and shall not be pledged, used for collateral, or in any way encumbered. Provided, however, this restriction may be released or modified by a two-thirds vote of the members present and voting at a special meeting of the temple called for such purpose, following written notice as specified in these by-laws.
- (c) If the value on September 30 is less than the value the previous September 30 then subparagraph (a) above shall not apply. Subparagraph (a) will be reinstated when the Fund on a September 30th has grown above the previous September 30th highest value.
- (d) The value of the Fund on any September 30th is to be determined by summing the value of the equity and fixed income stocks, the value of all investment real property (at cost) and additions of cash/interest/dividend & rental profit.

If the proposal is adopted by a 2/3 majority of members present and voting, the subparagraphs will be amended to read as follows:

- (a) An amount not to exceed 3% of the total value of the Fund, not to exceed \$150,000 in any year, may be used by the Board of Directors during the calendar year for paying current year budgeted expenses only.
- (b) The Fund, including additions to the Fund, are otherwise exempt from expenditure for any purpose whatsoever, and shall not be pledged, used for collateral, or in any way encumbered. Provided, however, this restriction may be released or modified by a two-thirds vote of the members present and voting at a special meeting of the temple called for such purpose, following written notice as specified in these by-laws.

Paragraphs (c) and (d) will be deleted.


